**Thomas P. Doyle Retrospective
Clericalism and Sexual Abuse Bibliographyⁱ**

1985-2017

Introduction

This retrospective bibliography focuses on the clergy sexual abuse victim advocacy work of Dominican priest and canon lawyer, the Rev. Dr. Thomas P. Doyle. It includes items written by him, items written about him, interviews with him, and published conference presentations. It also includes on-line speeches, interviews, and panel discussions.

This bibliography has been harvested from the World Wide Web. It does, however, also make reference to in-print materials from the world of paper and ink.

In compiling these bibliographic reference resources, I have consulted other bibliographic resources such as Dr. Doyle's curriculum vitae,² his irregularly updated personal bibliography of resources,³ Bishop Accountability's data bank,⁴ A. W. Richard Sipe's webpage⁵, and the *National Catholic Reporter's* list of Doyle's blogs, articles and other published work⁶. In addition, I have also performed multiple internet searches with variations of Dr. Doyle's name and professional credentials.

It is a certainty, however, that these various forms of academic searches have not located all of Doyle's published work. Essays and book chapters which have been translated into other international languages are not included. In addition, book chapters inside edited collections or anthologies often elude these kinds of internet-based search processes. The same is true of in-print encyclopedia references.

Thus, as the compiler of this cumulative bibliography, I make no claims that this is a complete bibliographical documentation of all of Dr. Doyle's body of published and unpublished work from 1985 until June 31, 2017.

This bibliographic resource is designed to be useful to undergraduate and graduate students; to academic researchers in a variety of academic disciplines; to clergy and religious institution administrators, to attorneys, and to clinicians: in short, anyone who wishes to study the inter-related or inter-correlated issues of clergy sexual abuse and institutional malfeasance in the religious sector. It should, therefore, be useful to academic professionals and independent researchers alike.

This research bibliography has a rich potential to be of use to sexual violence and sexual abuse advocates such as attorneys, psychotherapists, body workers, social case workers, or medical counselors. It can also be useful to church administrative personnel such as denominational executives, vicars for the clergy, professional ecclesiologists, theologians, pastoral theologians, ethicists, spiritual directors, and pastoral counselors. Its primary use, however, is likely to be inside the religious academy where these issues are studied and taught to new generations of undergraduate and graduate students.

Dr. Doyle is in no way responsible for any information data entry errors in this bibliography.

A Note about Structure

1. The bibliography which follows is divided by decades as a organizing structure. The first and the last decades are incomplete decades. This arrangement by date should make it easier for future additions to be made in a logical and sequential fashion. It also makes it possible for future researchers to follow the development of Doyle's work and thinking across time.

2. Each decade is broken into subsections but not all decades have precisely the same sub-sections. This organizing structure is essentially about a method of organizing what actually is as opposed to some arbitrary sense of design parity within each subsection. Thus, for example, some decades may have no you-tube presentations available on the internet. That section is, therefore, omitted. In each decade, subsections are headed in **bold face type** as a guide for users of this research tool.

While not every decade will include entries from each of the following, these kinds of subsections have guided the organization of this bibliography.

- Affidavits, courtroom testimony, depositions
- Articles about Dr. Doyle and his work
- Conference Addresses, Articles, Essays, Blog entries, Manuscripts
- Awards and honors
- Books and Monographs
- Book chapters
- Book Reviews
- Documentaries
- Interviews
- Journals, professional
- Letters and professional correspondence
- Written Speeches
- You tube presentations

3. In each segment entries are ordered by their location in time. More recent entries are followed by less recent ones. Inside each decade, the data is arranged by date rather than by alphabetical notations. Thus, for example:

- Item A (September 10, 2011) is listed before Item B (September 1, 2011).
- However, where two items occupy the same date, alphabetical enumeration is added. In this enumeration the letter A is listed before the letter B and so forth.

Note: Since some materials, as they appear on the World Wide Web have no visible dates, I have collated them at the very end of the Doyle-related materials and have located them just before the contextualization section of this bibliography.

A Note about the Internet as an Academic Resource

URL addresses change frequently – often for no apparent reason. That which once was found with one address must be re-sought. The best way to do this is with the exact title of an essay or blog-post. The second-best way to do this is with an author-content search heading, as for example, Thomas P. Doyle, Tom Doyle, Father Thomas P. Doyle, Thomas P. Doyle, OP, etc. The third best – and most time-consuming – is a content search by topic, for example, clericalism, but with no specific title or author's name.

One additional way to find obscure articles is to ask for pictures of Dr. Doyle with as many variations of his name and credentials as possible. I have found this to be a useful way to find articles and news reports I might not have been able to locate with a personal name, topic or title search.

There are multiple Roman Catholic priests with the name Thomas Doyle. There are artists, attorneys, physicians, athletes, and entertainers with the name Thomas Doyle. Therefore, the more specific the search engine request, the better the results.

In putting this bibliography together I have erred, therefore, on the side of inclusivity. I have learned to compulsively document internet addresses as part of every bibliographic notation. Several publication style manuals and professional journals require that you document the date on which you accessed the material, for example, *retrieved on March 1, 2017*.

For citations: As of February 28, 2017 every URL address marked with a * in this bibliography was functional. This is, therefore, the date on which these materials were retrieved. For every URL address marked with a > the recovery date was June 15, 2017.

A Note about Contextualization

An effort has been made to contextualize the Roman Catholic Church's (indeed the Christian Community's) inter-correlated sexual abuse phenomena: perpetrator sexual abuse and institutional criminality. Inasmuch as the bystander effect is also a facet of the milieu surrounding clergy sexual abuse, I have also included several information items about the bystander effect.

Consequently, several additional sections have been added at the end of the Doyle sections of this bibliography.

- Australia – The Royal Commission Into Institutional Responses to Child Abuse
- USA Grand Jury Reports are collated separately.
- Doyle's semi-annual bibliography of work he has read and consulted
- A section including the work of additional authors serves to contextualize current thinking about these complex, multi-faceted issues of abuse and clericalism in a wide variety of religious contexts. Catholic and other-than-Catholic resources are, therefore, included. Secular sources as well as religious sources are also included.
- World Wide Web Resources

Comment: Much more work remains to be done by multi-disciplinary religious, trauma research teams, and church-related professional healing communities if individually and collectively we are to understand these complex issues of clergy sexual abusiveness in a religious institution context. This contextualization bibliography, therefore, points towards possible multi-disciplinary and inter-denominational ways forward. It does not, however, seek to address all potential issues which are pertinent, relevant, contributing to, and derivative from Father Doyle's body of published work.

A Sub-Note about Missing Components

During the 1970's and early 1980's Dr. Doyle published extensively about canonical issues in Catholic thinking and ecclesiastical legislation. Most particularly he wrote about the issues of marriage, divorce, and annulments inside the Catholic canon law tradition. In addition, he has an extensive collection of writings about the application of canon law to church management issues. This bibliography does not include information about these publications. Users of this research bibliography are referred to Doyle's curriculum vitae and to his irregularly published bibliography for information about accessing those canonical resources. To gain access to information about these items, see www.richardsipe.com and use the search button.

In addition, this bibliography does not include the voices of sexual abuse survivors. It does not include the voices of the survivors of institutional clericalism. It does not include the voices of survivors' family members. It does not include the lay voices of the congregation which has been torn and battered by the presence of a sexual predator in clerical garb.

Likewise, it does not include the collective voices of sexual abuse advocacy groups such as Link-up, SNAP, Road to Recovery, Catholic Whistleblowers, Voice of the Faithful, National Survivors Coalition, etc.

With the exception of the contextualization bibliography, this bibliography does not include information and resources from the Protestant or Free Church traditions.

It does not include information from other-than-Christian traditions.

It also does not include the vast literature on trauma, therapy and healing work.

Finally, it does not comprehensively include the voices of Doyle's harshest critics. Where Doyle has been demonized for his work, I believe there is a political context to this criticism. As a non-Catholic, I am not competent to evaluate this Doyle-antagonistic literature and to assess whether or not it is part of an organized and overtly hostile-political church push-back. This element of Doyle studies must become the work of Roman Catholic scholars who, as insiders, understand the Catholic Church during this era of time in ways that I, an outsider, can never accomplish.

This bibliography begins in 1985 when Doyle first began to write about the clergy sexual abuse phenomenon inside the USA Roman Catholic Church.
